An educator, fully aware of Elijah's severe dairy allergy, gave my son a food containing an allergen to which he was severely allergic. The gravity of this lapse is heartbreaking, but what deepens the wound is that, amidst this crisis, they failed to provide emergency support - they did not call 911. This crucial lapse, this devastating chain of events, extinguished the bright light of my son, forever altering the trajectory of my family's life.

My grief was transformative. Like standing on the precipice of a deep abyss, we were engulfed by an unfathomable void of loss. Yet, from the profound silence of that void emerged a spark. Driven by the ashes of our pain, my son's mother, Dina and I made a solemn vow: our son's life would not dissolve into an overlooked tragedy.

This vow sparked the inception of the Elijah-Alavi Foundation. A lighthouse amidst the stormy waters of asthma, food allergies and anaphylaxis, our foundation want to give parents and children peace of mind when navigating allergies and that they will never be alone. We are committed to providing knowledge, resources, and unwavering support.

One of our early victories was the implementation of Elijah's Law in New York State. This groundbreaking legislation, now active in Illinois and Virginia as well, mandates daycare centers, preschools, and after-school programs to have anaphylaxis policies, trained staff, and individual care plans for children with food allergies. Our relentless efforts continue to ensure that this law becomes a nationwide norm.

However, we recognize that the battle isn't over. Our aspiration is to advance Elijah's Law to a federal level, promising safety for every child in every corner of the nation.

In furthering our advocacy, the Elijah's Echo Ambassador Program was born. Our ambassadors, imbibed with the spirit of Elijah's story, become agents of change within their communities, driving collective action towards creating safer spaces for children with food allergies.

Among our significant feats was the collaborative creation of a Public Service Announcement (PSA), "Spell It Out." This unique synthesis of storytelling and meaningful messaging earned us an Emmy Award. Yet, this is not the only recognition our efforts have garnered. We have been honored with numerous other awards, testament to our relentless commitment to inciting change.

Parallel to this advocacy journey, I have walked a path of personal growth and knowledge at Touro University Worldwide.
